Aim

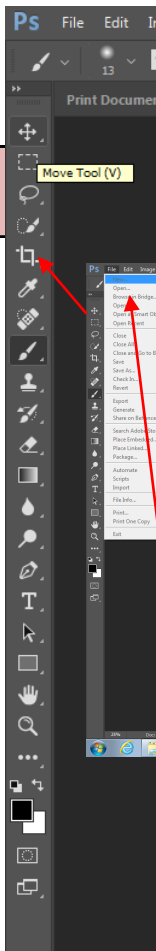

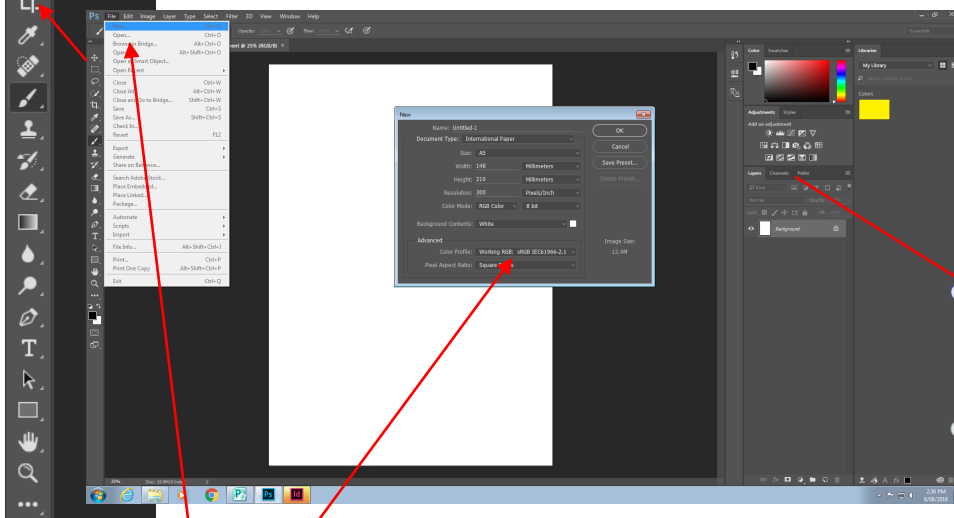

The Toolbar



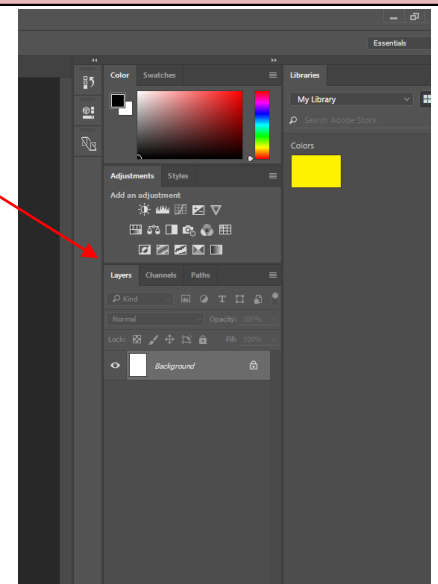
When you hover over an icon, the name of the tool pops up.

Getting Started



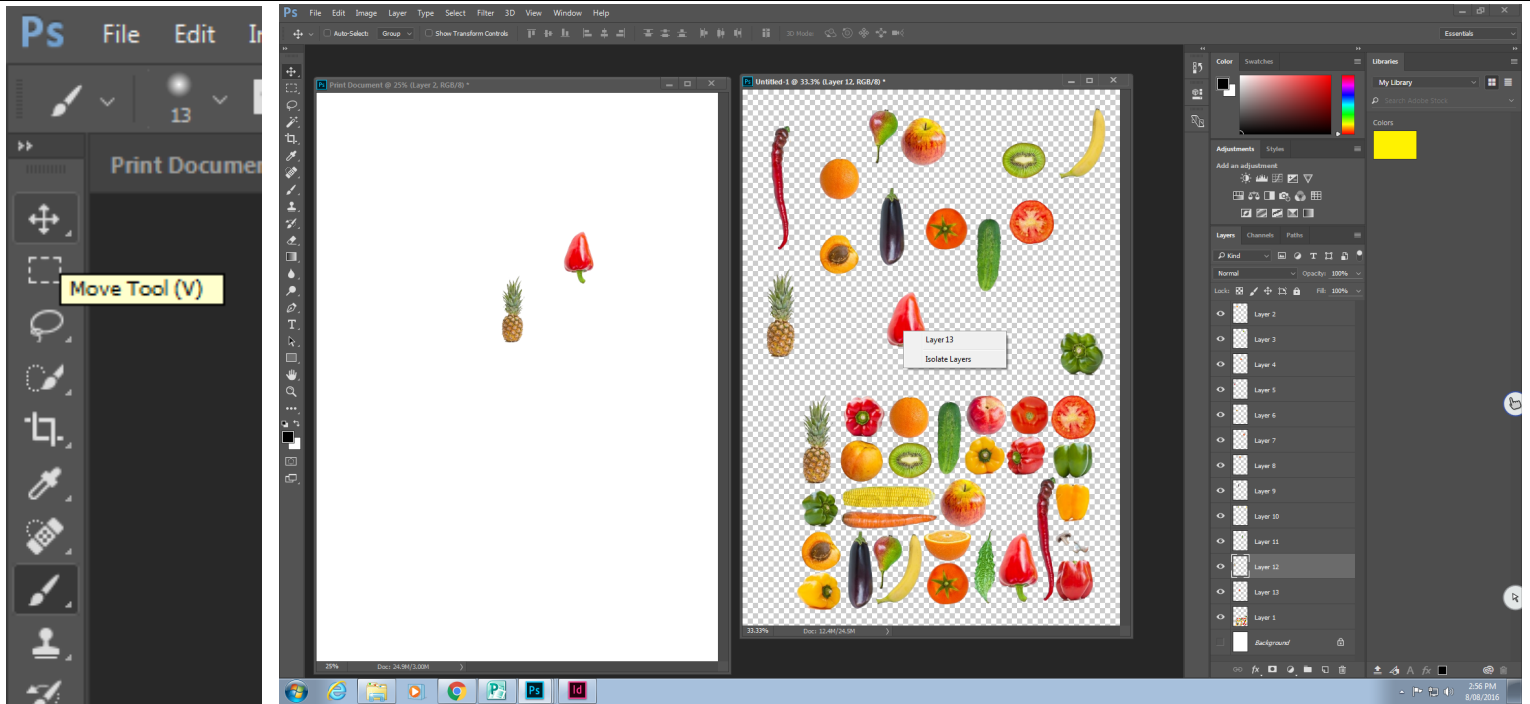
File—New—A5—300 Pixels/Inch (118.11 Pixels/cm)
Creates a background layer.
File—open—(source file)

The Layers Palette



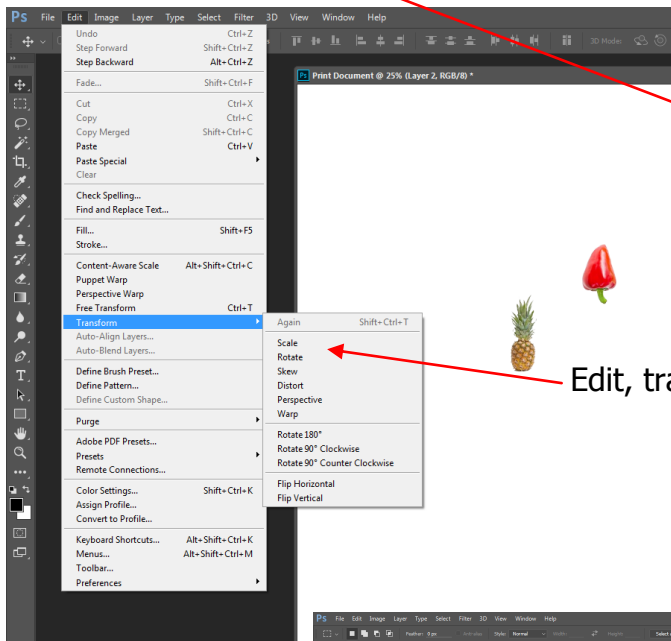
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Right click on the image to find out what layer it is on.
